Mass Feastdays for the week of October 6th

Mon., Our Lady of the Rosary: This Memorial, established by Pope St. Pius V in thanksgiving for the victory at Lepanto, Oct. 7, 1571, recalls the rosary & its meditation on the mysteries of Christ and our salvation.

Tues., Weekday Wed., St. Denis, bishop, & Companions, martyrs; St. John Leonardi, priest: Denis, or Dionysius, died 258; first bishop of Paris; martyred with the presbyter, Eleutherius, & the deacon, Rusticus; patron of Paris & of France. John Leonardi, died 1609; founded the Congregation of Clerics Regular of the Mother of God; in 1579 he formed the *Confraternity of Christian Doctrine*, & published a compendium of Christian doctrine in use until the 19th c.; cofounded with St. Philip Neri at Rome the Collegio Urbano which, under the charge of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, trains priests for the foreign missions.

Thur., Weekday Fri., St. John XXIII, Pope: Born of a farming family in northern Italy in 1881, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was ordained a priest in 1904. As a papal diplomat, Roncalli helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people during World War II. Elected pope in 1958 at age 78, taking the name John. He convoked the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), with his feast day being the day of the 1st session of the Council. He was canonized by Pope Francis in 2014. Sat., Weekday
