FROM THE Pastor's Desk

LEISURE TIME NEEDED TO FIND GOD

You need leisure to find God, according to priest-psychologist Father Henri Nouwen, an internationally known spiritual writer.

But in a world where people seek their value in what they do, getting the leisure to find God is tough - though vital for spiritual growth and happiness.

"You're not what you do," said the Dutch cleric countering the chief message of today's society. "Your deepest identity is in God."

The former Yale professor, now living in Canada, talked about leisure as it relates to prayer. Leisure is a "radical idea" because most people look - wrongly - for their identity "in what they do and how they advance," he said.

It takes leisure to get in touch with the fact that "God loved you long before you accomplished anything or had any results in your work," he said. When you realize that, "what you do, later, is an expression of gratitude that you're loved."

Father Nouwen called leisure "a way of being that's hard to accept because it demands a radical shift from an identity given by the world to an identity given by God."

"People fear that if they do nothing, they'll lose themselves," he said. It's hard to "stop being subject to the obsessiveness of the world and rest in God."

Many find leisure hard because the voice of God is deeply hidden in them. When they sit quietly for long, they get "anxious, very, very nervous and think of what they didn't do," he said. They need to know that within them is "God's voice, the love which a child perceives."

"Leisure is essentially connected with prayer," Father Nouwen said.

"Prayer means to dwell with God and let God love you, speak to you, hold you... to say to you, 'You are my beloved son, my beloved daughter, my favorite child.'"

When you know that, he said, "You can go into the world and do a lot - but it's not compulsive, not obsessive."

People fill free time with activities, but right use of leisure calls for discipline and accepting God.

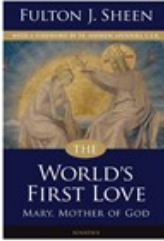
