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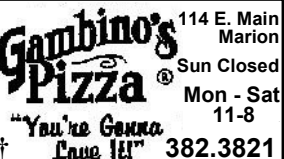
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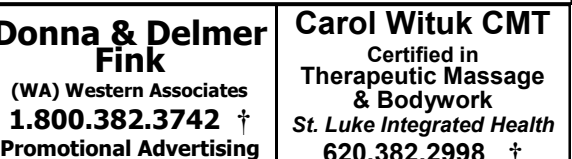
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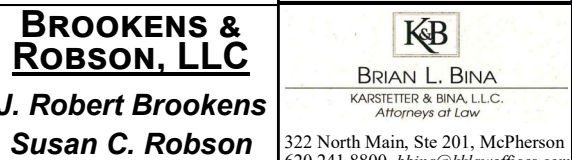

Feast days for week of Aug 1st: Mon., St. Eusebius of Vercelli, bishop;
St. Peter Julian Eymard, priest: Eusebius, died 371; considered the found-
er of the canons regular in the West; exiled to Palestine by Constantius; with
St. Hilary, an opponent of Arianism. Peter Julian Eymard, died Aug 1, 1868;
founded the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament, today numbering some
875 members; founded the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament; influenced
the founding of the Eucharistic Fraternity for the laity, the Association of
Priest Adorers, & international Eucharistic congresses. **Tues., Weekday**
Wed., St. John Vianney, priest: Jean-Marie Vianney, died 1859; universally
known as the "Cure of Ars"; compassionate spiritual counselor who spent no
less than 11 hours every day in the confessional in winter, 16 in the summer;
patron of priests & the parish clergy. **Thurs., The Dedication of the Ba-**
silica of St. Mary Major: Following the declaration of Mary as "God-Bearer"
by the Council of Ephesus in 431, Pope Sixtus III erected in Rome this oldest
basilica in the West dedicated to the Mother of God. **Fri., The Transfigura-**
tion of the Lord Sat., St. Sixtus II, pope, & Companions, martyrs; St.
Cajetan, priest: Sixtus II & 4 deacons were arrested on Aug. 6, 258 while
celebrating the Eucharist in the cemetery of Callistus; by order of Valerian,
they were decapitated that same day; Sixtus named in Roman Canon.
Cajetan, died 1547; from Venice; cofounded the Theatines, who number
about 175 religious; devoted to reform, prayer, & ministry to poor & sick.

Feast days for week of Aug. 8th: Mon., St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, virgin, martyr: Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) born Jewish, Germany, 1891; baptized Catholic, 1922; entered Carmelite convent, 1933 where she received the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross; killed at Auschwitz, 1942; declared co-patroness of Europe (with St. Catherine of Siena & St. Bridget of Sweden) by Pope John Paul II. Tues., St. Lawrence, deacon, martyr: Lawrence, died 258, burned alive on a gridiron; after Sts. Peter & Paul, Lawrence is venerated as patron of Rome; mentioned in the Roman Canon. Wed., St. Clare, virgin: Clare of Assisi, died 1253; disciple of St. Francis; founded the Poor Clares whose 1st convent at Assisi she directed as abbess for 42 years; led an austere life, rich in the practice of charity & loving care. Thurs., St. Jane Frances de Chantal, religious: Jane Fremiot, died 1641; wife of Baron de Chantal & mother of 6 children; as a widow, with St. Francis de Sales, her spiritual director, she founded in 1610 the Visitation nuns; established some 85 monasteries. Fri., Sts. Pontian, pope, & Hippolytus, priest, martyrs: Pontian, died 235; bishop of Rome banished by Maximinius Thrax to Sardinia where he was reconciled with Hippolytus; before dying, he abdicated his office to make way for his successor (1st pope to do so); buried in the cemetery of Callistus. Hippolytus, died 235/236; Roman priest & stern rigorist; 1st anti-pope; exiled to Sardinia with Pontian; source of Eucharistic Prayer II. Sat., St. Maximilian Kolbe, priest, martyr: Maximilian Mary Kolbe, died 1941 at Auschwitz by lethal injection; born in Poland; founded Militia of Mary Immaculate; offered his life in exchange for the father of a family. Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Sunday: Rv 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab 1 Cor 15:20-27 Lk 1:39-56

South Korea honors Father Kapaun with country's highest military honor

Father Emil Kapaun, a priest of the Wichita Diocese who laid down his life as a military chaplain during the Korean War, received South Korea's highest military decoration posthumously in Seoul July 27. Ray Kapaun, Father Kapaun's nephew, accepted the Order of Military Merit on behalf his uncle, a candidate for sainthood, from President Moon Jae-in. The award, South Korea's highest decoration for outstanding military service, was given to the "Jesus of the Korean War," as Father Kapaun is known, for his dedication to peace and freedom on the battlefields of Korea. It was presented on the 71st U.N. Forces Participation Day. Ray Kapaun's wife, Lee, accompanied her husband at the presentation at Cheongwadae, known as the Blue House. It is the executive office and official residence of the president.

Father Kapaun, who has the title "Servant of God," was ordained a priest for Wichita June 9, 1940. He served as a U.S. Army chaplain in World War II and the Korean War and held the rank of captain. He died in 1951 in a North Korean POW camp after heroically serving his fellow prisoners. His cause for canonization is now under consideration by the Vatican Congregation for Saints' Causes.

"Under the extreme situation of being wounded and taken prisoner, Father Kapaun showed bravery of protecting freedom, peace and his belief," said Moon, according to a Korea Times story on the award presentation. "Also, he celebrated Mass to pray for the enemy, which was a true practice of love," said Moon, who is Catholic. He added the late priest's life "will become a great spiritual legacy for not only the U.S. and Korea but also for all of humanity."

In March, Father Kapaun's remains were identified by the U.S. Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency from among nearly 800 unknown soldiers buried around 1956 in the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific in Honolulu. The transfer from North Korea was the result of the 1953 Korean Armistice Agreement. His remains will be flown to Kansas after a Mass Sept. 23 in Honolulu's Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Peace. A vigil will be held the evening of Sept. 28 at Hartman Arena in Park City, Kansas, just outside Wichita. A morning funeral Mass will be celebrated at the arena the next day. Afterward the priest's remains will be entombed in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Wichita.
