Feast days for week of Aug 15th: Mon., St. Stephen of Hungary: Stephen, died 1038; as the 1st Christian king of Hungary he united & Christianized the Magyar people; received the “holy crown” from Pope Sylvester II in 1000; renowned for his charity to beggars; known as the “Apostolic King & Apostle of Hungary.” Tues., Weekday
Wed., Weekday Thurs., St. John Eudes, priest: John Eudes, died 1680; founded the Congregation of Jesus & Mary, for training the clergy; also founded the Sisters of the Good Shepherd to assist morally endangered women, especially prostitutes; promoted cult to the Hearts of Jesus & Mary. Fri., St. Bernard, abbot, doctor of the Church: Bernard, died 1153; Cistercian abbot of Clairvaux; reformer & spiritual author; preached against the Albigensians; founded 68 monasteries; preached the 2nd Crusade; denounced injustice & worked for peace; patron of Gibraltar. Sat., St. Pius X, pope: Pius X, died Aug 20, 1914; undertook liturgical & canonical reforms, especially communion for children & frequent communion for adults; condemned Modernism; wished “to renew all things in Christ”; patron of sick pilgrims. 21st Sunday in Ordinary

Padre Pio prayer
Many believe this is a powerful prayer because it calls upon the heart of Jesus to have mercy on us and our petitions. Jesus’ heart is indeed full of love and compassion and this prayer trusts in that love, believing that he is tender enough to generously grant our petition if it is in his holy will.
Above all things it must be prayed with a sincere faith, as Padre Pio would have prayed it, and not as a candy dispenser. God is not a genie who grants us whatever wish we desire, but instead responds in love to a child who asks for something, knowing exactly what we need.
I. O my Jesus, you have said: “Truly I say to you, ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and it will be opened to you.” Behold I knock, I seek and ask for the grace of (here name your request) Our Father Hail Mary Glory Be to the Father Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.
II. O my Jesus, you have said: “Truly I say to you, if you ask anything of the Father in my name, he will give it to you.” Behold, in your name, I ask the Father for the grace of (here name your request) Our Father Hail Mary Glory Be to the Father Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.
III. O my Jesus, you have said: “Truly I say to you, heaven and earth will pass away but my words will not pass away.” Encouraged by your infallible words I now ask for the grace of (here name your request) Our Father Hail Mary Glory Be to the Father ... Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.
O Sacred Heart of Jesus, for whom it is impossible not to have compassion on the afflicted, have pity on us miserable sinners and grant us the grace which we ask of you, through the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary, your tender Mother and ours.
Say the Hail, Holy Queen and add: St. Joseph, foster father of Jesus, pray for us.

FRUITS OF THE HOLY ROSARY
When we immerse ourselves in our daily Rosary, we reap the bounty of its fruits. As we pray this centuries-old prayer given to us by the Blessed Virgin herself, united with countless families, friends and Rosary confraternities, we enter into the mysteries of the life of Jesus, growing in our knowledge and understanding of him and conforming our lives toward his. We gain the strength to resist temptation and evil, we find peace within, we are inspired to love our neighbor, and we are compelled to become evangelizers of the living Word, who is Jesus. And most importantly, the Blessed Virgin leads us deeper into the love of Jesus—perhaps that is the greatest fruit that she wants us to obtain.
Many of us conclude the Rosary with this prayer, entreating God to bless us with the fruits that are obtained by meditating upon its mysteries:
Let us pray. O God, Whose Only-Begotten Son, by His life, death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life: grant, we beseech Thee, that by meditating upon these mysteries of the most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, that we may imitate what they contain, and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
