Feast days for week of Aug 22nd: Mon., **St. Rose of Lima, virgin:** Isabel Flores de Oliva, died 1617 at age 31; Peruvian mystic; nicknamed "Rosa" because of her beauty; O.P. tertiary who lived a life of penance & solitude, caring for the homeless, elderly, & sick; first declared saint of the New World; patroness of the Philippines & of South America, especially Peru; also of florists & gardeners. **Tues., St. Bartholomew, apostle:** Bartholomew, died 1st century; known as Nathaniel in John's Gospel; preached the Gospel in India & Armenia where he was flayed alive. **Wed., St. Louis; St. Joseph Calasanz, priest:** Louis IX of France, died 1270; model ruler & father of 11 children; Franciscan tertiary who cared especially for lepers; built Sainte Chapelle in Paris as a reliquary for the crown of thorns; patron of masons & sculptors. Joseph Calasanz, died 1648; founded Clerics Regular of Religious Schools, today numbering some 1,345 religious; dedicated to helping poor children; patron of all Christian schools dedicated to assisting the poor. **Thurs., Weekday Fri., St. Monica:** Monica, died 387; after 30 years of prayer, she obtained the conversion of her dissolute pagan husband; under the guidance of St. Ambrose, she won the conversion of her eldest son, St. Augustine; patroness of mothers. **Sat., St. Augustine, bishop, doctor of the Church:** Augustine, died 430; born in Tagaste, north Africa; after a dissolute life, he received baptism at age 33 from St. Ambrose; elected bishop of Hippo; combatted Manichees, the Donatists, & Pelagius; most noted for his *Confessions* and *City of God*; one of the 4 great doctors of the Latin Church; called the "Doctor of Grace." **22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time:** Dt 4:1-2, 6-8 Jas 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27 Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

HUNGRY FOR CHRIST: Thank you to Laurie Holub for taking over the Hungry for Christ ministry! Holy Family Parish has a Fasting Group for encouragement and support. The goal of the group is to fast on Fridays throughout the year for the salvation of souls and any other intentions. **Here’s how it works:** You will receive an email prior to the fast day. You choose the level at which you would like to participate. After the fast day, you will receive an email that will call for a self-determined “grade” on a scale of 0-10. This is purely voluntary, but it allows the facilitator to report an aggregate of our efforts. You should give yourself extra credit for attending Mass, a holy hour and other devotions. Add one credit for each item added to the fast. You should subtract from your score if you are lacking in charity, such as being cross with your family or others. Mary, Queen of Heaven

The feast day of the “Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary” is August 22nd. Notice that we celebrate her Assumption into heaven on August 15th, before we celebrate her coronation.
This honorary title of Queen of Heaven, the 5th Glorious Mystery of the Rosary, is rooted in Scripture. For just as there was the office of King in the Old Testament, so there was the office of Queen Mother. As noted biblical scholar Dr. Scott Hahn points out:
David's first successor, Solomon, reigned with his mother, Bathsheba, at his right hand. Israel's queen mother, or gebirah ("great lady"), appears, then, through the history of the monarchy, to the very end.
Consider the following scene from early in Solomon's reign: "So Bathsheba went to King Solomon, to speak to him on behalf of Adonijah. And the king rose to meet her, and bowed down to her; then he sat on his throne, and had a seat brought for the king's mother; and she sat on his right" (1 Kgs 2:19).
This short passage packs implicit volumes about Israel's court protocol and power structure. First, we see that the queen mother was approaching her son in order to speak on behalf of another person. This confirms what we know about queen mothers in other Near Eastern cultures.
Next, we notice that Solomon rose from his throne when his mother entered the room. This makes the queen mother unique among the royal subjects. Anyone else would, following protocol, rise in Solomon's presence; even the king's wives were required to bow before him (1 Kgs 1:16). Yet Solomon rose to honor Bathsheba. Moreover, he showed further respect by bowing before her and by seating her in the place of greatest honor, at his right hand.
Rejoice, my soul, that Mary, thy Mother, has been crowned by the Almighty, Queen of All Saints, and proclaimed by Him Sovereign and Mistress of heaven and earth.
