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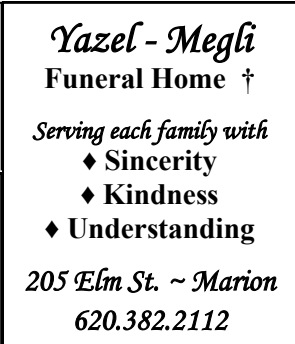

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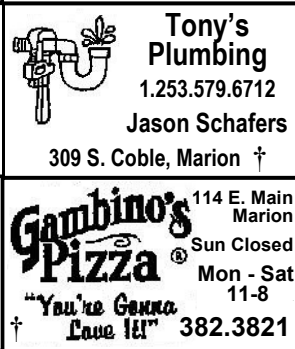

JEST KIDDING: Of all the things you wear, your expression is the most important.

Feast days for week of Oct 10th: Mon., St. John XXIII, Pope: Born of a farming family in northern Italy in 1881, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was ordained a priest in 1904. As a papal diplomat, Roncalli helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people during World War II. Elected pope in 1958 at age 78, he took the name John. He convoked the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), with his feast day being the day of the 1st session of the Council. He was canonized by Pope Francis in 2014. **Tues., Weekday Wed., Weekday Thurs., St. Callistus I, pope, martyr:** Callistus I, died 222; incurred the ire of Tertullian & Hippolytus over *lapsi* controversy; organized the 1st official Christian cemetery in Rome & instituted Ember Day fasts.
Fri., St. Teresa of Jesus, virgin, doctor of the Church: Teresa of Avila, died 1582 at Alba; Spanish mystic who, with St. John of the Cross, founded the reformed (Discalced) Carmelite friars & nuns, for which she had to endure great trials; authored *Way of Perfection*, *Interior Castle*, & an autobiography; 1st woman declared “Doctor of the Church” (1970); patroness of Spain.
Sat., St. Hedwig, religious; St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, virgin: Hedwig, died 1243; born in Bavaria; duchess of Silesia & mother of 7; peacemaker dedicated to the poor & prisoners; as a widow, retired to a Cistercian convent. Margaret Mary, died 1690 at age 43; French Visitandine mystic who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a feast which helped free the Church from the spirit of Jansenism; promoted 1st Friday devotion.

Punctuation . . . And Life . . .

When an author uses a semi-colon, he wants you to pause. To think about what he just wrote. Then you continue on with the rest of the sentence until you get to the period, which is the end.

Sometimes, we get overwhelmed with life . . . the sorrows, the pains, sometimes it just is too much. In that dark despair that clouds our minds, some give up and take their own life. They use a period instead of a semi-colon.

God, our creator, who loves us with a love that the human mind cannot comprehend, wants to be the author of the period.

Only He knows that “definite service” that John Newman writes about in the article above. When life gets hard and the future seems bleak, with no joy in sight, remember to use the semi-colon.

Just pause. Breathe. And look up — to the Author of Life.

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IMPROVEMENTS TO THE BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS OF OUR PARISH IN 2020-2021:
