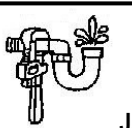
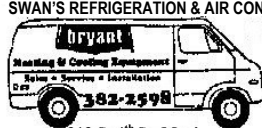

CHURCH OFFICE CLOSED NEXT WEEK.

Feast days for week of Oct 17th: Mon., St. Luke, evangelist: Luke, died 1st c.; Syrian physician from Antioch & companion of St. Paul; authored (c. 70-85) Acts of the Apostles & a Gospel for gentile Christians; it speaks of God's mercy, universal salvation, love of the poor & the marginalized, absolute renunciation, prayer, & the Holy Spirit; represented by a winged ox; patron of the medical profession, painters, artists, sculptors, & butchers. Tues., Sts. John de Brebeuf & Isaac Jogues, priests, & companions, martyrs: French Jesuit & oblate missionaries to the Hurons

& Iroquois of North America, died 1642-1649; Isaac was tomahawked to death by Iroquois in 1646 near Albany; John was savagely mutilated & slain in 1649 near Georgian Bay; secondary patrons of Canada. Wed., St. Paul of the Cross, priest: Paul of the Cross, died 1775; renowned preacher & founder of the Passionists, today numbering about 1,970 members, who combine the apostolate of retreats & missions with penitential monasticism. Thurs., Weekday Fri., St. John Paul II, pope: Karol Jozef Wotjtyla, born 1920 in Poland; took part in Second Vatican Council; elected pope 1978 & took the name John Paul II. Made numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. He left as a heritage to the Church a rich Magisterium & the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the revised Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church & Eastern Churches, & the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal*. Died 2005, canonized by Pope Francis 2014. Sat., St. John of Capistrano, priest: John of Capistrano, died 1456; O.F.M.; reformer of the Franciscans & Poor Clares; preached devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus; animated resistance against the Turks at the battle of Belgrade; patron of military chaplains. 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Jer 31:7-9 Heb 5:1-6 Mk 10:46-52

EYE GLASS GLARE ON YOUR CHURCH DIRECTORY PICTURE—
The glare from your eye glasses will be removed in your picture that goes in the directory at no charge. A \$40 portrait retouch fee will get glare removed from your free 8x10 or any purchased pictures, and other retouches you specify, such as removing wrinkles.

ONLY HALF OF THE PARISH HAVE TURNED IN REGISTRATION FORMS for the church directory. The last church directory was published in 2016. If a new registration form has not been turned in, some important information in the directory will not be updated: address or phone number changes, or new babies. For instance, many people have cancelled their land line phone, which is the default number to publish in the directory, unless a new registration form is completed that specifies a different primary number. The deadline to submit forms has been **extended to Oct. 31st.**
