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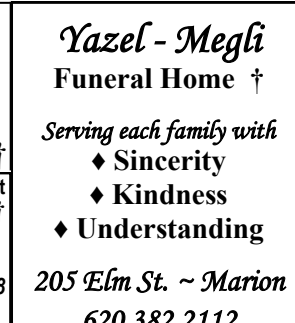
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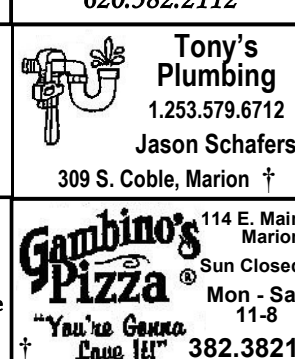
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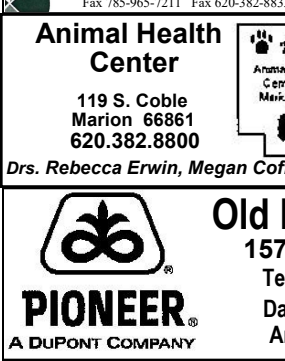

Feast days for week of Nov. 14th: Mon., St. Albert the Great, bish-

op, doctor of the Church: Albert, died 1280; O.P. master of philoso-
phy, theology, & the natural sciences, especially Aristotle; teacher of
St. Thomas Aquinas; bishop of Regensburg; prolific writer (38 quarto
volumes in print); patron of scientists.

Tues., St. Margaret of Scotland; St. Gertrude, Virgin: Margaret, died 1093; from Hun-
gary; wife of King Malcolm III of Scotland & mother of 8; helped root out paganism; her love for the poor became legendary; pa-
troness of Scotland. Gertrude, called "the Great," died 1301; mystic of the famous Benedictine abbey of Helfta in Saxony; wrote on
the meaning of suffering, the Sacred Heart, the Trinity, & God's love.

Wed., St. Elizabeth of Hungary, religious: Elizabeth,
died 1231 at age 24; wife of Louis IV of Thuringia & mother of 3; as a widow, she became a Franciscan tertiary, dedicated to the
needs of the poor & the sick; canonized only 4 years after her death; patroness of the Franciscan Third Order & of Catholic chari-
ties.

Thurs., The Dedication of the Basilica of Sts. Peter & Paul, Apostles; St. Rose Philippine Duchesne, virgin: Rose
Philippine Duchesne, died 1852 at age 83 in Missouri; from Grenoble, France; founded the 1st American house of the Religious of
the Sacred Heart; opened the 1st American free school west of the Mississippi; known for her courage & desire to serve Native
Americans, esp. the Potawatomi who called her the "woman who prays always."

"HOME AT LAST"

A REFLECTION ON THE RETURN OF FR. KAPAUN'S MORTAL REMAINS TO KANSAS

The week of Father Kapaun's remains returning to Pilsen was the highlight of my time as a tour guide in Pilsen. Seeing how the town of Pilsen came together to prepare for this historical event was simply amazing to experience.

Seeing how the community cleaned up the church, the grounds, trimming the trees and mowing the lawns, and all the painting done to beautify the town was spectacular! So many jobs that had needed doing for a long time . . . got done! From repairing the ropes in the bell tower to cleaning the large stone cross in the cemetery. It was definitely a community effort!

Seeing the flags that lined the street for miles was breath-taking. Watching the hearse pull into the drive as the bells rang, bells that we hadn't heard ring in Pilsen in many, many years, tugged at our hearts. The bells rang that day to welcome Father Kapaun home from the war, 70 years after he had died in the prison camp of Korea.

The many parishioners in the sapphire blue t-shirts with the slogan "Home At Last" bearing the picture of the church, statue, and flag-draped coffin, touched our hearts. Father Kapaun was home! Only for a few days, but he was finally back in his hometown of Pilsen!

Watching the hometown boys, dressed in their blue "Home At Last" shirts, carry Father Kapaun out of the church for his trip back to Wichita was a sight to behold. The love and reverence of these men as they carried Father down the steps of the church and placed him into the hearse brought us to tears. Father was leaving us once again!

Thank you, Holy Family Parish of Pilsen, for making Father Kapaun's homecoming so memorable, not only for those of us in the parish, but also for the Kapaun family and the visitors!
