Feast days for week of Nov. 21st: Mon., St. Cecilia, virgin, martyr: Cecilia, died 3rd century; mentioned in the Roman Canon; patroness of sacred music because of the song of God in her heart. Tues., St. Clement I, pope, martyr; St. Columban, abbot; Blessed Miguel Agustin Pro, priest, martyr: Clement I, died c. 100 under Trajan; 4th bishop of Rome; wrote famous epistle to the Corinthians; mentioned in the Roman Canon. Columban, died 615; Irish monk & missionary to France; founded monasteries; exiled to Italy for denouncing court immorality & lax bishops. Miguel Pro, died 1927 at age 36; from Guadalupe, Mexico; during Mexican religious persecution, he was accused of plotting against the government & was executed while exclaiming, "Long live Christ the King!" Wed., St. Andrew Dung-Lac, priest, & his Companions, martyrs: During the 17th-19th centuries in Vietnam, some 130,000 Christians suffered cruel martyrdom, many by decapitation or strangulation; today 117 are remembered; includes 96 Vietnamese (37 priests, including Andrew Dung-Lac, died 1839); all canonized in 1988 by Pope John Paul II. Thurs., St. Catherine of Alexandria, virgin, martyr: Catherine was a learned woman of the early 4th century who, following her conversion at age 18, preached the Gospel throughout Egypt. While imprisoned by the emperor Magnus Maximus, she converted both the empress & the leader of the armed forces, & for this she was martyred. Upon her death, after a wheel of torture (known as "Catherine's wheel") broke, her body was carried by angels to Mt. Sinai. Patron saint of philosophers, preachers, & young unmarried women. CHAPLAIN KAPAUN MUSEUM
TOUR GUIDES

We are tour guides at the Chaplain Kapaun Museum! We are here to guide the visitors to Pilsen through the church and through the museum, but we do much more than that. We help them to see how an Army Chaplain “spent himself for God” while serving his fellowmen in Korea during battle and then in the prison camps of Korea. We make the story of Fr. Kapaun come alive for them!



Many come to Pilsen to learn the story of Chaplain Kapaun for the first time. As we process through his story, showing them the church he attended as a youth, and then served as the parish priest, you can see their interest in him increase. They want to touch the baptismal font where he was baptized. Wrap their hands around the processional cross, carried by Father as an altar boy and by his brother, Eugene, to lead the procession for Father’s first Mass in Pilsen. By the time we have reached the replica of the cross carved in Korea in Chaplain Kapaun's honor the tears are shining in their eyes.

We continue the tour over at the old rectory, which is the museum started by Rose Mary Neu-wirth in honor of Chaplain Kapaun. We start in the room where Enos and Bessie learned their son was missing in action, Thanksgiving day, 1950. We let them see and feel the pain of a family torn apart by war.

We call this room “Fr. Kapaun’s room” because everything in it was given to us by Eugene, the brother of Fr. Kapaun. It contains the bed frame Emil and Eugene slept in as children. Chaplain Kapaun's Army foot locker and the cross he gave to Amelia Vinduska when he left to become a Chaplain. He gave Amelia the cross to thank her for assisting him at Mass by answering the Latin prayers when he had no altar boys. As we walk through the museum, we tell Father’s story of faith, his love for his fellow man, and his courage as he faced death.

Some of our visitors tell us that they know Father’s story, and then they take the tour. Our visitors soon learn all that they *didn’t* know about Fr. Kapaun. They see models of the huts in which the prisoners were held captive. They see a model of the prison camp and the cage they were placed in; they hear stories of the Army helmet, the canteen; they see the statues carved in Father’s honor.

When the tour is near completion, our visitors learn about Chaplain Kapaun’s alleged miracles. Father now has six alleged miracles with stories of so many others that say Fr. Kapaun heard their prayers and interceded for them. As they hear the stories of the alleged miracles, the tears stream down their faces and you can see the spark of hope in the eyes of those who are hurting and seeking Father’s intercession.

Our visitors stop at the gift shop containing medals, t-shirts, videos, rosaries, and many pictures of Chaplain Kapaun. They leave with a smile and a whole new appreciation of Chaplain Emil Kapaun, his devotion to God, his love for his fellowmen, and the courage he displayed on the battle-field and in the prison camps of Korea.

For all of us, it is an honor and a privilege to serve as a tour guide in the Chaplain Kapaun museum.
