Pastor's Desk

Why are Zoey and Zoe pronounced the same but Joey and Joe are not?

The fact that Kansas and Arkansas are pronounced so different bothers me way more than it should.

Feast days for week of Jan. 16th: Mon., **St. Anthony, abbot:** Anthony or Antony, died 356 at age 105; born in upper Egypt; hermit & early founder of religious life; called the “Patriarch of Monks”; aided St. Athanasius of Alexandria in combating Arianism. **Tues., Weekday** **Wed., Weekday** **Thurs., St. Fabian, pope, martyr; St. Sebastian, martyr:** Fabian, died 250 under Decius; layman elected bishop of Rome in 236; an “incomparable man, the glory of whose death corresponded with the holiness of his life”; his body came to be transferred from the catacombs of Callistus to the basilica of St. Sebastian. Sebastian, died 288 at Rome under Diocletian; chief of the Praetorian cohort whose *acta* tells of his being pierced by arrows, later being clubbed to death; patron of archers, soldiers, & police associations. **Fri., St. Agnes, virgin, martyr:** Agnes, died beginning of 4th c. under Diocletian at the age of 12; patroness of Christian virtue confronted by political & social violence; represented with a martyr's palm & a lamb (her name in Latin is lamb); the wool from 2 lambs blessed today will be used to make the pallia which will be blessed by the pope on June 29; mentioned in the Roman Canon. **Sat., Weekday**

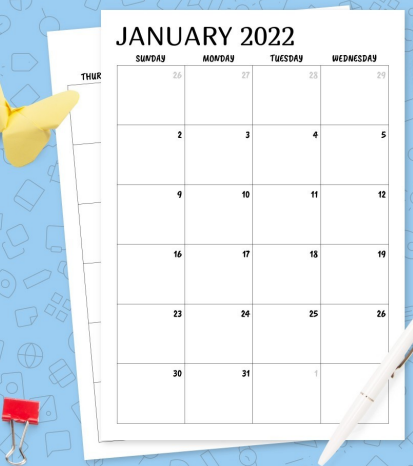
