Feast days for week of May 1st: Mon., St. Mark, Evangelist: Mark, 1st century; cousin of Barnabas; associated with Sts. Paul & Peter; the Gospel ascribed to him is the oldest (written probably prior to the fall of Jerusalem in 70 AD) & shortest; tradition holds Mark as the 1st bishop of Alexandria; portrayed as a winged lion; patron of notaries, of Egypt, & of Venice. Tues., Easter Weekday Wed., Easter Weekday Thurs., St. Peter Chanel, priest, martyr; St. Louis Grignon de Montfort, priest: Peter Mary Chanel, died 1841; French Marist missionary on the Pacific islands of Wallis & Futuna where he was martyred; destroyed cult of evil spirits; protomartyr & patron of Oceania. Louis Mary de Montfort, died 1716; hospital chaplain & founder of the Congregation of the Daughters of Wisdom; founded the Missionaries of the Company of Mary, today numbering about 850 religious; chief work: True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin. Fri., St. Catherine of Siena, virgin, doctor of the church: Catherine, died 1380; O.P. tertiary, mystic, & author (The Dialogue); peacemaker within the Church & renewer of religious life; worked toward ending the Avignon papacy under Gregory XI; declared doctor of the Church in 1970; patroness of Italy and, together with St. Bridget of Sweden & St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, co-patroness of Europe. Sat., St. Pius V, Pope: Pius V, died May 1, 1572; O.P. who implemented the reforms of the Council of Trent; promulgated the Roman Catechism, the Roman Missal, & the Roman Breviary; canonized May 22, 1712. 3rd Sunday of Easter: Acts 5:27-32, 40b—41 Rv 5:11-14 Jn 21:1-19

Fourth part of the Pastoral Statement on Abortion written by Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of San Angelo
Abortion is the Greatest and Gravest Moral-Pastoral issue facing the Universal Church

Our pastoral actions must include working with government and court agencies at a local, state and national level.

As we mark the remembrance of the Supreme Court decision on abortion in 1973, we must now more than ever promote legal and civil action to overcome this death sentence. We need to remember and take action from what the Supreme Court admitted in Roe v Wade: "if...personhood (for the unborn) is established, the appellant's case, of course, collapses, for the fetus right to life is then guaranteed specifically by the 14th Amendment".

Based on this conditional statement, and science has confirmed that life begins at conception, so the members of the Supreme Court are obligated to rescind the decision of Roe v Wade. The 14th Amendment to the Constitution states: "nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty or property, without due process of the law, nor to deny any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the law".

Science is now totally clear that human life begins at conception when a new human being is formed, and the American people must now oppose abortion on demand and want innocent life to be protected especially when it is most defenseless.

It now belongs to Congress, if the Supreme Court does not reverse itself to resolve the question of when human life begins. For this to happen, we must all now support A Life at Conception Act, by declaring that unborn children are persons legally entitled to Constitutional protection. This fact will rescue millions of unborn children from dying by abortion on demand.

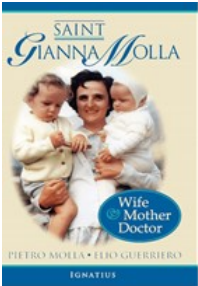

DIVINE MERCY

NOVENA: As in years past, the parish will pray the Divine Mercy Novena prayer before the Chaplet beginning Good Friday, and ending on Divine Mercy Sunday.

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us — all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering **ABC**:

A-Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

B-Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

C-Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.
