Pro-Life Answers to False Pro-Choice Arguments

"There are other issues just as important as abortion such as homelessness, health care, poverty and the economy."

This philosophy is generally advanced by two groups of people.

The first group is closet pro-abortionists who fully realize that abortion is terribly wrong and want to avoid revealing their position on abortion.

The other group is luke-warm pro-lifers who are looking for some way to justify their own inaction on abortion, or more often, to justify voting for a pro-abortion politician. By equating abortion with other social ills, they are both attempting to neutralize the abortion issue and silence pro-lifers.

To expose what a scam this really is, just ask one of these people if they would ever vote for a white supremacist on the basis that race is just "one of many issues".

Obviously, there is no denying that America faces many societal problems. However, if abortion is the taking of human life---which most definitely it is and even the most die-hard advocates of abortion have to admit----then our country is engaged in the largest holocaust in history.

To suggest that the wholesale slaughter of approximately 60 million children (since 1973) ---a number which increases by more than 3,000 each day---is even in the same universe as tax policy, or homelessness, or poverty, or any other issue, is both heartless and indefensible. Indeed, for someone who claims to be a Christian to make such a statement is pornographic.

We pray that society will see that it cannot love women while killing their children, and cannot save children without helping their mothers.

We pray that people will be touched by the pro-life question, “Why can’t we love them both?”

VALUE THEM BOTH: On August 2nd, we will have our chance to protect women and babies in Kansas by voting YES for the VALUE THEM BOTH Amendment to our state constitution.

ATTENTION: This amendment will be decided based on the voting done at **the primary on August 2nd**. It is critical that everyone vote in the primary as this will **NOT** be on the ballot in November!! The deadline to register to vote in the primary is July 12th at 5pm at the courthouse. This is our only chance! Also — for those who are unaffiliated with a political party, you will only be able to vote on issues, such as the Value Them Both Amendment. Although you are not choosing the person of your party [Republican, Democrat, or Libertarian] to appear on the ballot in November, you can still vote! **Every single vote counts!**
