Feast days for week of July 24th: Mon., St. James, Apostle: James, brother of John, is called "the Greater" because he followed Christ before the other apostle of the same name; first of the 12 to be martyred, being decapitated by order of Herod Agrippa I, c. 44; venerated at Compostella, Spain; named in the Roman Canon; patron of pilgrims, of Spain, Guatemala, & Nicaragua. **Tues., Sts. Joachim & Anne, parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary:** Names for the parents of Mary found in the 2nd c. *Protoevangelium of James*; Anne is patroness of childless women & miners; Joachim is patron of fathers & grandparents. **Wed., Weekday Thurs., Weekday Fri., Sts. Martha, Mary & Lazarus:** In the household of Bethany, Jesus experienced the family spirit & friendship of Martha, Mary & Lazarus. Martha generously offered Jesus hospitality, Mary listened attentively to His words, & Lazarus promptly emerged from the tomb at the command of Jesus who humiliated death itself. Pope Francis added Sts. Mary & Lazarus to the Obligatory Memorial of St. Martha in 2021. **Sat., St. Peter Chrysologus, bishop, doctor of the Church:** Peter, died c. 450; called "Chrysologus", meaning "of golden speech" for his exceptional preaching. **18th Sunday in Ordinary Time:** Eccl 1:2; 2:21-23 Col 3:1-5, 9-11 Lk 12:13-21

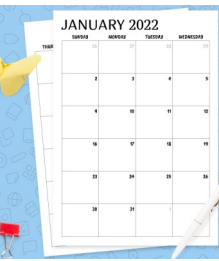

Pro-Life Answers to False Pro-Choice Arguments

"I am opposed to abortion, but I don't believe I have the right to impose my personal beliefs on others".

You will sometimes hear this stated by members of the general public, but it is more commonly said by politicians who are trying to "finesse" the abortion issue. The trick is to appear philosophically pro-life so they do not have to defend the reality of abortion, and functionally, pro-abortion so they do not upset the abortion lobby. They think that this is a shrewd view, when in fact it is just a cowardly one. Unfortunately, for political expediency, many of our "Catholic" politicians take this hypocritical and shameful position!

Understand that the only logical basis for someone to be "personally opposed to abortion" is because they realize that abortion terminates the life of an innocent human being. While claiming to believe that however, they say it should be legal. So what they are really saying is, "Abortion is the intentional killing of a helpless child, but I wouldn't do anything to stop it. I am willing to look the other way while someone else takes the life of a child".

That is a smoke screen. Only a coward and/or a hypocrite would concede that unborn children are living human beings but that it is none of his (or her) business if someone wants to abort them.

It is no different than saying that they are opposed to rape but it is none of their business if men want to rape women, or that rape is not an area in which the government should be involved.

We live in a nation where over 3,500 innocent children lose their lives each and every day to the intentional act of abortion. If this is not an area of legitimate governmental interest, then the government has no legitimate interest at all!

KEY MESSAGE OF VALUE THEM BOTH: In 2019, an activist state court radically changed the Kansas Constitution, making it impossible to regulate abortion in even the simplest of ways. Unlike our neighboring states, taxpayer-funded and late-term abortion could soon be 100% allowed in Kansas **unless** you vote “Yes” on the Value Them Both Amendment August 2nd.

- Restores our Constitution to the way it was before a 2019 court ruling cleared the path for nearly unlimited abortion in Kansas.

We must vote “Yes” to ensure Kansas does not remain a destination state for extreme abortions in unregulated facilities.
