Feast days for week of Aug. 7th: Mon., St. Dominic, priest: Dominic de Guzman, died Aug 6, 1221; founded the Order of Preachers, today numbering some 6,550 religious; an elective, fraternal form of community life devoted to contemplation, study, & preaching; sought to bring Albigensians back into the Church through preaching & living evangelical poverty; canonized in 1234. **Tues., St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, virgin, martyr:** Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) was born in Breslau, Germany in 1891 of Jewish parents. She was received into the Catholic Church in 1922, & in 1933 entered the Carmelite convent in Cologne where she received the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. In 1942 she was killed at Auschwitz. Along with St. Catherine of Siena & St. Bridget of Sweden, she was declared co-patroness of Europe by Pope John Paul II. **Wed., St. Lawrence, deacon, martyr:** Lawrence, died 258, four days after 4 other deacons & Pope Sixtus II were killed; cared for the temporal welfare of the Roman Church; said to have been burned alive on a gridiron; after Sts. Peter & Paul, Lawrence is venerated as patron of Rome; mentioned in the Roman Canon. **Thurs., St. Clare, virgin:** Clare of Assisi, died 1253; disciple of St. Francis; founded the Poor Clares whose 1st convent at Assisi she directed as abbess for 42 years; led an austere life, rich in the practice of charity & loving care. **Fri., St. Jane Frances de Chantal, religious:** Jane Fremiot, died 1641; wife of Baron de Chantal & mother of 6 children, 2 of whom died at birth; as a widow, with St. Francis de Sales, her spiritual director, she founded in 1610 the Visitation nuns; established some 85 monasteries before her death. **Sat., Sts. Pontian, pope, & Hippolytus, priest, martyrs:** Pontian, died 235; bishop of Rome banished by Maximinius Thrax to Sardinia where he was reconciled with Hippolytus; before dying, he abdicated his office to make way for his successor (1st pope to do so); buried in the cemetery of Callistus. Hippolytus, died 235/236; Roman priest & stern rigorist; 1st anti-pope; exiled to Sardinia with Pontian; source of Eucharistic Prayer II. **20th Sunday in Ordinary Time:** Jer 38:4-6, 8-10 Heb 12:1-4 Lk 12:49-53

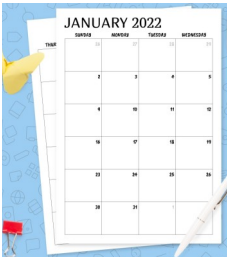
