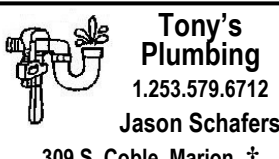
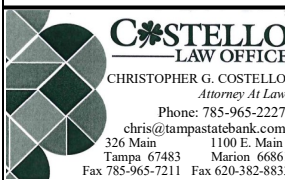
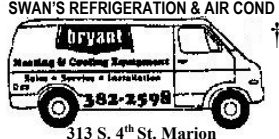

Tues., Weekday Wed., Weekday Thurs., Weekday Fri., Sts. Simon & Jude, apostles: Simon, died 1st century; called “the Canaanite” & also “the Zealot,” an anti-Roman party; mentioned in the Roman Canon. Due to these circumstances, the minimum suggested donation for the expected number will be \$3/person at Marion and Florence and \$5 at Pilsen. 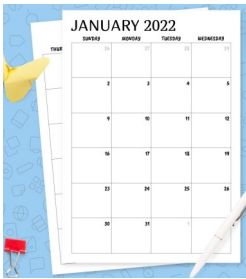

THE MILITARY PILGRIMAGE TO PILSEN

Fr. Phillip Creider, a priest of the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City, with the permission of Fr. Bebak, will be celebrating Mass for us in Pilsen on Veteran’s Day. Fr. Creider was a member of the Navy Chaplains Corps. He served with the Artillery and Infantry of the Second Marine Division at Camp Lejeune, in Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm. Fr. Creider has been a Chaplain for 20 years and has served all over the world.

His last tour of duty as a Chaplain was as Command Chaplain and PHIBRON Chaplain on board USS BOXER (LPD-4). During his time aboard the USS BOXER he was deployed for 7 months on the Western Pacific Cruise whose highlight was to serve as the Flagship for Anti-Piracy Operation off the coast of Somalia, participating in the rescue of the Captain of the MAERSK ALABAMA, a civilian merchant vessel captured by Somali Pirates.

At the present time, following a call of God, and with the permission of the Archbishop Paul S. Coakley, he began the life of a solitary religious contemplative, living alone with God. He purchased acreage near Shawnee, Oklahoma, where he has a log home on his property, and spends the weekdays following the Benedictine motto of “Ora et Labora” [“Work and Prayer”].
