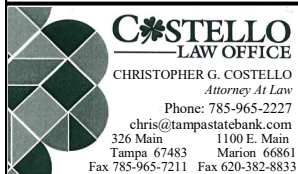
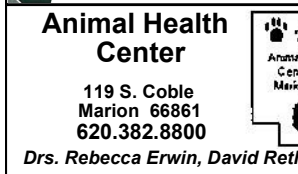
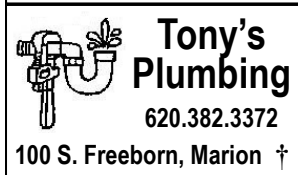

Feast Days for the week of Oct. 14th: Mon., St. Teresa of Jesus, virgin, doctor of the Church: Teresa of Avila, died 1582 at Alba; Spanish mystic who, with St. John of the Cross, founded the reformed (Discalced) Carmelite friars & nuns, for which she had to endure great trials; authored *Way of Perfection*, *Interior Castle*, & an autobiography; 1st woman declared "Doctor of the Church" (1970); patroness of Spain. Tues., St. Hedwig, religious; St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, virgin: Hedwig, died 1243; born in Bavaria; duchess of Silesia & mother of 7; peacemaker dedicated to the poor & prisoners; as a widow, retired to a Cistercian convent. Margaret Mary, died 1690 at age 43; French Visitandine mystic who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a feast which helped free the Church from the spirit of Jansenism; promoted 1st Friday devotion. Wed., St. Ignatius of Antioch, bishop, martyr: Ignatius, died c. 107 under Trajan in Rome's amphitheater; Apostolic Father known as the 2nd successor of St. Peter in Antioch; wrote 7 letters to local communities on church unity & structure, especially the monoespiscopacy; first to use the term "Catholic Church" as a collective designation for Christians; mentioned in the Roman Canon. Thur., St. Luke, evangelist: Luke, died 1st c.; Syrian physician from Antioch & companion of St. Paul; authored (c. 70-85) Acts of the Apostles & a Gospel for gentile Christians; it speaks of God's mercy, universal salvation, love of the poor & the marginalized, absolute renunciation, prayer, & the Holy Spirit; represented by a winged ox; patron of the medical profession, painters, artists, sculptors, & butchers. Fri., Sts. John de Brebeuf & Isaac Jogues, priests, & companions, martyrs: French Jesuit & oblate missionaries to the Hurons & Iroquois of North America, died 1642-1649; Isaac was tomahawked to death by Iroquois in 1646 near Albany; John was savagely mutilated & slain in 1649 near Georgian Bay; secondary patrons of Canada. Sat., St. Paul of the Cross, priest: Paul of the Cross, died 1775; renowned preacher & founder of the Passionists, today numbering about 2,055 members, who combine apostolate of retreats & missions with penitential monasticism.

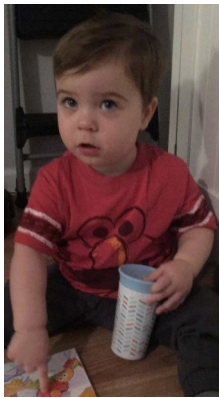

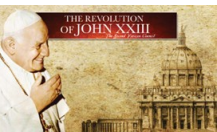

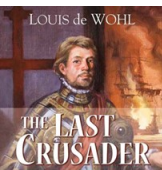
