Feast Days for the week of Oct. 21st
Mon., St. John Paul II, pope: Karol Jozef Wojtyla, born 1920 in Poland; took part in Second Vatican Council; elected pope 1978 & took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people, & the sick, led him to make numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. He left as a heritage to the Church a rich Magisterium & the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the revised Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church & Eastern Churches, & the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal*. Died Apr. 2, 2005. Canonized by Pope Francis on April 27, 2014.
Tues., St. John of Capistrano, priest: John of Capistrano, died 1456; O.F.M.; reformer of the Franciscans & Poor Clares; preached devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus; animated resistance against the Turks at the battle of Belgrade; patron of military chaplains.
Wed., St. Anthony Mary Claret, bishop: Anthony Claret, died 1870; vigorous reforming bishop of Santiago, Cuba; founded the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (Claretians), today numbering about 3,065 members; fostered credit unions & the apostolate of the press.

FROM THE Pastor's Desk

Catholic Religious Education begins at home

Christianity is a religion and a faith for adults, it is not a children's religion. Christ was always open to the children, but His life was directed toward adults.

As Catholics, we need an adult faith, adult perseverance, adult response to God's Living Word. The emphasis must be on adult education, not just to relearn what we absorbed as children in CCD or PSR, but to grow by knowledge and experience in our faith to a maturity of the faith within us.

None of us would or should send our children to school to teach them to love—love comes from the home directly from God through loving parents and can certainly be enriched by learning outside the home.

Too often, however, we have sent our children or even just "dropped them off" at PSR, so that they could be taught the faith.

Again, the Catholic Faith must properly start in a loving home, first and foremost, and then be properly enriched by PSR. The Church can only supplement the faith that comes from the parents. For the Church to assume, or the parents to allow it to accept, the responsibility of raising their children in the faith is a disservice to all involved.

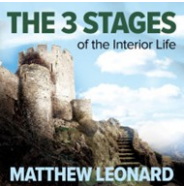
