Feast days for week of July 9th: Mon., Weekday Tues., **St. Benedict, abbot:** Benedict, died 547; wrote famous monastic Rule noted for its wisdom & moderation & need for obedience: “Let all follow the Rule as their guide in everything, & let no one rashly depart from it.” Founded 12 monasteries; Benedictines today number some 6,800 religious; considered the “Patriarch of Western Monasticism”; a patron of Europe. **Wed., Weekday** Thurs., **St. Henry:** Henry II, died 1024; together with his wife, St. Cunegunda, assisted the poor; as emperor, he respected the Church's freedom, fostering ecclesiastical & monastic reform; founded the See of Bamberg as a center for missions to the Slavs; patron of Benedictine oblates. **Fri., St. Kateri Tekakwitha, virgin:** Kateri, died 1680, at age 24 in Quebec; led a life of great austerity & love in spite of ridicule & abuse; called “Lily of the Mohawks”; first native American to be declared “Blessed” [1980]; canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2012. **Sat., St. Bonaventure, bishop, doctor of the Church:** Bonaventure, died 1274; Cardinal bishop of Albano; authored biblical commentaries & many ascetical & spiritual treatises; known as the “Seraphic Doctor.” **15th Sunday in Ordinary Time:** Is 55:10-11 Rom 8:18-23 Mt 13:1-23

FROM THE OFFICE OF RESPECT LIFE & SOCIAL JUSTICE: The latest abortion stats from the Kansas Department of Health & Environment, presented at the Kansas Catholic Conference:

Abortions overall increased by 57% from 2021 to 2022.

Abortion total in 2021:	7,849
Abortion total in 2022:	12,318

From 2022 abortions, the top 3 methods used were:

Suction:	4,212 (34.2%)
D&E:	616 (5%)
Chemical:	7,339 (59.6%)

Abortions performed on out-of-state residents also increased from 2021 by 31%.

Out-of-state residents in 2021:	3,912
Out-of-state residents in 2022:	8,475

Top three states where women traveled from were Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas. Their breakdowns are as follows:

Missouri: Decrease of 17% from 2021	
2021:	3,458
2022:	2,883
Oklahoma: Increase of 1,388% from 2021	
2021:	137
2022:	2,026
Texas: Increase of 1,178% from 2021	
2021:	233
2022:	2,978

More context: latest state abortion statistics show the following shocking impacts:

- 57% increase in the overall annual number of abortions – the largest year-over-year increase since statistics have been recorded;
- 29% increase in painful, live dismemberment abortions;
- 117% increase in abortions performed on out-of-state residents, with two abortions being performed on out-of-state residents for every one performed on a Kansas resident;

38% increase in the number of chemical pill abortions;

48.5% increase in the number of abortions performed on minor girls.

A number of states neighboring Kansas have banned abortion since the U.S. Supreme Court overturned Roe vs. Wade last year, including Missouri, Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas.

Abortion is now banned in 13 states; in Wisconsin doctors are banned from performing abortions and will be charged with a felony if they do.

Six other states such as Georgia, Nebraska, Arizona, Florida, Utah and North Carolina are enforcing bans based on the gestational age of the fetus.

North Carolina now enforces a 20-week ban with a 12-week ban set to start July 1.

What you can do:

Increase your prayers for women facing unplanned pregnancies, along with prayers for those working and volunteering in our many pregnancy resource centers, that they continue to be Christ’s light to these women during their most vulnerable time of need.

Support your local Pregnancy Resource center by hosting supply drives, and such.

Host an informational meeting provided by our office at your parish to learn more about Walking with Moms in Need - a ministry to support women facing an unplanned pregnancy.

Pray for a conversion of heart for all those working in the abortion industry.

Talk to and learn about the views of your elected representative and help them understand the importance of each child as created in the image and likeness of God.

It is not enough to be aware of the numbers, we must remember that each number stands for a child God created. As a Catholic Community we have to work harder, reach out better and make resources known to women in unplanned pregnancies.
