Feast Days for the week of May 19th: Mon., St. Bernardine of Siena, priest: Bernardine, died 1444; O.F.M.; famous reformer & eloquent preacher who traveled throughout Italy; encouraged devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus; known for his use of the monogram, *IHS* (an abbreviation of the Greek name for Jesus); patron of advertisers & advertising; invoked against hoarseness. Tues., St. Christopher Magallanes, priest, & Companions, martyrs: Christopher Magallanes & 21 diocesan priests & 3 laymen were either shot or hanged († 1915-1937) for their association with the *Cristero* uprising which opposed the anti-Catholic Mexican government in the 1920's. The *Cristero* motto was, "Long live Christ the King & the Virgin of Guadalupe!" Wed., St. Rita of Cascia, religious: Rita was born in 1381 in Umbria. She lived with a brutal husband & had 2 sons. After the violent murder of her husband, she urged forgiveness in contrast to the customary vendetta of her day. Becoming an Augustinian nun, she spent some 40 years in prayer, contemplation, & service to the sick & poor. Toward the end of her life, she received a wound from a thorn from the crown of thorns. She died in 1457. Patron saint of desperate situations. Thur., Easter Weekday Fri., Easter Weekday Sat., St. Bede the Venerable, Priest, Doctor of the Church; St. Gregory VII, Pope; St. Mary Magdalene de'Pazzi, Virgin: Bede, died 735; O.S.B.; called "Venerable" while still living; known as the "Father of English history." Gregory VII, died 1085; O.S.B.; championed reform of the clergy against simony, clerical marriage & lay investiture, leading to the excommunication of Henry IV; expanded the authority of the Roman See. Mary Magdalene de'Pazzi, died 1607; Carmelite mystic of Florence who led a hidden life of prayer & self-denial, praying particularly for the renewal of the Church & encouraging her fellow sisters in holiness. 6th Sunday of Easter: Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 Rv 21:10-14, 22-23 Jn 14:23-29

FAMILY AND WORLD PEACE

Despite all the sincere efforts to bring about world peace and security, we cannot possibly succeed in such a laudable purpose until first there is a true sanctification of the family. For the family is the unit of all larger social organization. From its good order flows the peace and security of the world. The family, then, has importance not only to its members but to that larger brotherhood which we know as our world society.

Nothing impresses a child more than the sight of mother and father kneeling in adoration and devotion before the altar of God.

Nothing is a more powerful human incentive for the child to approach Communion than the example of his own parents.

And nothing gives the child a greater sense of security and of “belonging” than to be present in the family group at Mass and to receive Communion as a member of that circle.

Such a child begins now to think not only of himself but also of those about him whom he loves. He develops a wider social consciousness much broader than that of his own immediate personal needs.
