Mass Readings for the week of June 30th

Mon., St. Junipero Serra, priest: Junipero Serra, died 1784; from Petra, Majorca, Spain; O.F.M. missionary who arrived in New Spain in 1750; established nine of the California missions; baptized over 6,000 native peoples; recognized as a builder of the state of California; "an exemplary model of the selfless evangelizer" (Pope John Paul II). **Tues.: Weekday** **Wed., St. Thomas, apostle:** Thomas, died 1st century; his doubting gave way to faith when he saw the risen Lord; associated with founding the Church in south India; mentioned in the Roman Canon; patron of builders, India, & Pakistan. **Thur.: Weekday** **Fri., St. Anthony Zaccaria, priest; St. Elizabeth of Portugal:** Anthony Zaccaria, died 1539 at Cremona at age 36; doctor turned priest; popular preacher who founded (1530) in Milan the Clerics Regular of St. Paul for the reform of society; today they number some 400 members; sought collaboration between the clergy & the laity; promoted frequent communion. Elizabeth, died 1336; named after her great-aunt, St. Elizabeth of Hungary; queen & mother; lover of the poor; peacemaker in the royal family; later a Franciscan tertiary; patroness of Catholic charities. **Sat., St. Maria Goretti, Virgin, Martyr:** Maria Goretti, died 1902 at age 12; she was stabbed to death, preferring to die than to be raped; with her mother present, she was canonized in 1950 before the largest crowd ever assembled at that time in Rome for a canonization; patroness of teenage girls.

We get worked up over the latest crisis (a much overworked word these days, both in Church and State — engendering a perpetual state of mental anxiety), yet we hardly give a second thought to a meanness or unkindness done to our neighbor, that is, to Christ.

We worry about what this world is coming to, instead of where we're going, which is of much greater importance.

There's only one way to overcome the pessimism and gloom so prevalent among us, both as Catholics and as citizens, and that is to renew our own personal faith and trust in God. Our entire society must cease trying to erase God from the landscape and acknowledge He is the Landscape.

BIKING FOR BABIES: BIKING A+CROSS AMERICA, ONE MILE AT A TIME

Biking for Babies is a national, pro-life, non-profit organization that was founded in 2009. At that time, co-founders Jimmy Becker and Mike Schaefer had a vision of young men and women using their God-given physical talents to raise awareness and support for pregnancy resource centers (PRCs) across the country. Jimmy and Mike took up their bikes and cycled across the state of Illinois, talking with those they encountered, to raise this awareness. They also raised over \$14,000 that they donated to a life-affirming PRC in Illinois.

Since 2009, Biking for Babies has grown each year, raising over \$550,000, and today involves more than 30 missionaries (riders and their support crews) and supports approximately 40 PRCs across 15 states. Missionaries are partnered with a PRC, forming a personal relationship with them throughout the year, and spreading the word of the life-saving stories from that particular center.

This summer from July 7 to July 13, Biking for Babies missionaries will depart as teams from 4 locations on their long-distance bike ride: Green Bay, WI; Columbus, OH; Tylertown, MS; and Holly, CO. Each route will cover 600-800 miles during the week and converge in St. Louis, MO for a Celebration of Life event on July 13 (<https://www.bikingforbabies.com/celebration-of-life/>). The Western route, consisting of 8 missionaries, will be starting on July 7th.

The team of 5 bikers and 3 support crew will bike into Marion on the afternoon of **Tuesday, July 9th**. Please attend our parish potluck that evening at **6pm at the MAC** to meet these missionaries. Last year the stories they shared about how and why they are promoting the culture of life were heart-warming and gave great hope for this coming generation. Bring your friends to eat and visit with the team to hear more about rebuilding a Culture of Life with Biking for Babies!
